
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We also suggest you might embroider both of the client's lace designs with a narrow 2mm silk ribbon and silk thread, and isolate some of the design elements - (See swatch above that we did for Ralph Lauren Collection in black.)

For the floral white plain lace, follow the pattern of a few random flowers and embroider using the silk ribbon. Stitch the vinery and fine areas using matching col. silk thread. Decorate the centers of the flowers with tiny french knots and small micro-sized white beads - keeping very delicate. Do the border edge to match, perhaps embroidering every other flower on the border.

For the ivory corded lace, just decorate the centers of a few random flowers using the same techniques, perhaps just using the silk thread and beads - not the silk ribbon. Would be nice to make the cording more decorative in some areas also. Client is looking for very lightweight fragile elegant look for both patterns.
